

- **Engineered Hardwood:** A great choice for homeowners who prefer a natural wood finish without the fragility of solid hardwood.




2. Pet-Friendly Furniture That Looks Sophisticated

- Stylish mats or tiled nooks under feeding areas for easy cleanup.




5. Opt for Pet-Safe Materials and Finishes


Your home should not only look good but also ensure the health and safety of your pets. Choose non-toxic paints, sealants, and finishes that won't emit harmful fumes.
