Cheaper imitations often use thinner ply or lightweight MDF in the headboard wings, which can lead to sagging or fabric puckering within a year or two of daily use. Quality frames use a sprung or slatted base beneath the mattress deck, allowing airflow and reducing the risk of damp or mould building up underneath, which is a particularly relevant consideration in older British homes with less consistent ventilation.

The upholstery itself is generally attached using a combination of deep buttoning techniques and hand dressed pleating around the wings, a labour intensive process that explains part of the price difference between entry level and premium ambassador frames. Fabric Choices and What They Mean for Everyday Living

Fabric selection dramatically changes both the look and the practicality of an ambassador bed. The three most common options in the UK market are

- Elet offers the richest, most luxurious appearance and is the fabric most closely associated with the ambassador silhouette. It's soft to the touch, holds colour saturation well under both daylight and artificial lighting tends to photograph beautifully for anyone styling a bedroom for social sharing. The tradeoff is that electronics can show pressure

marks or pile flattening in high traffic areas, though most marks brush out with a soft bristle upholstery brush.

Caring for Your Ambassador Bed
