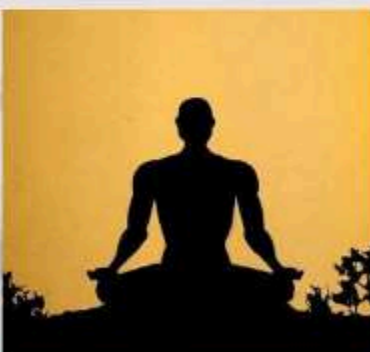
### A Day of Deep Devotion
